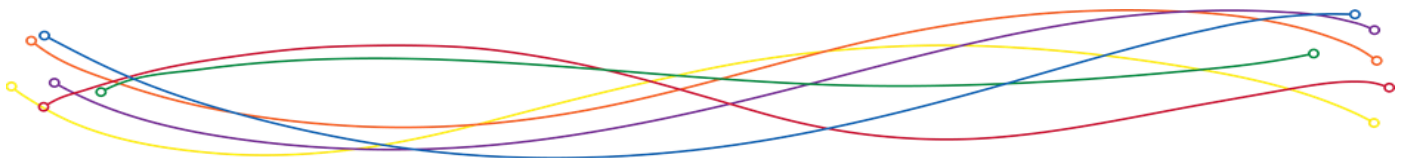
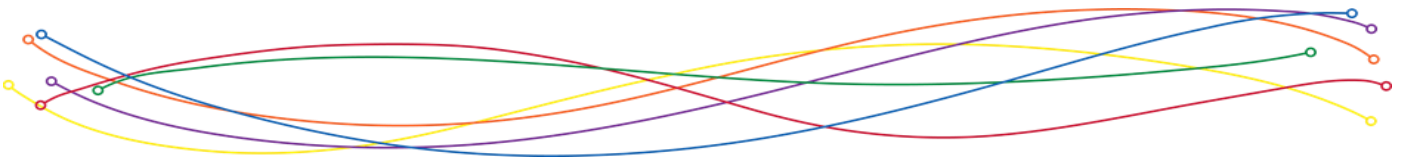


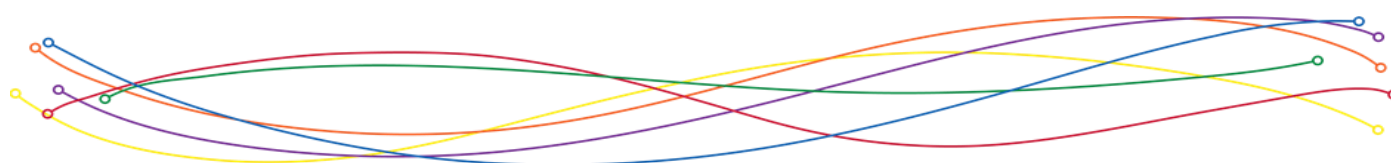

INFORMED AND CONNECTED COMMUNITY

Throughout 2023-24 Merredin CRC provided many opportunities for the Merredin community to learn about and interact with technology. Events including Canva Introduction courses, Xero course, Scams Awareness and many one-on-one sessions for learning how to do Online Shopping, and how to download and use the Services WA app on phones. The Staff also have been busy helping people with the transition from 3G to 4G.

From January 2022, The Phoenix ceased being a regional newspaper. Over 300 hard copies were printed and distributed to 12 local businesses who agreed to sell the newspapers with no commission. Online subscriptions remained steady. Between June 2023 – June 2024, The Phoenix published 24 editions selling over 6,000 copies. The Phoenix still remains a relevant way to keep the Merredin community informed and connected.

In addition to the above, Merredin CRC has a Website that is kept up to date, a Facebook page that regularly posts about upcoming events as well as traditional methods of posters and flyers displayed and disseminated through the community. We have recently created an Instagram page in hopes to connect with a younger audience.

A SENSE OF PLACE & BELONGING

To create a sense of place and belonging, Merredin CRC has continued to use successful strategies such as being a welcoming and friendly community hub, offer community events and activities to encourage community participation and connections, and bring life to the streets.

In October 2023, Merredin CRC once again held the annual Senior's Luncheon, with just over 100 attendees. Approximately 12 volunteers helped with food preparation, cooking and serving.

Merredin College students were involved in the event by assisting with taking orders & serving, and St Marys Primary School Choir performed for the attendees.

The Men's Shed assisted with set-up and pack-up.



Three Market events were held during the year which had a total of 63 stalls. Volunteers assisted with food stalls and other CRC activities whilst the Men's Shed assisted with set-up and pack-up. The April one was a Twilight market, the December markets focused on Christmas, which included a visit from Santa and Mrs Claus. The June markets were early morning ones, which were in collaboration with The Biggest Morning Tea. A fashion parade was put on by Jayne Camelman and thoroughly enjoyed by all.



The 2024 Australia Day Breakfast had approximately 300 attendees. Volunteers assisted on the day and in the week leading up to the event. The Shire uses the Breakfast to present their Citizenship Awards. The event was well attended and supported by the community. The festivities of Australia Day kicked off with the annual breakfast at the Merredin Community Resource Centre, courtesy of staff, committee members, and volunteers. The air was quickly filled with the delicious smell of sizzling bacon and sausages cooked by the Merredin Men's Shed, while the attendees gathered on the lawn area to enjoy a fresh cup of coffee courtesy of Wheatbelt Coffee Time.



The Merredin Men's Shed and Merredin CRC enjoy a very positive relationship. To show our appreciation Merredin CRC always provide the Men's Shed volunteers with morning/afternoon tea at any events that the Men's Shed assist with.

On Tuesday the 28th of May, Amity Health, in partnership with the Merredin Community Resource Centre held a Community Services Morning Tea in the Merredin CRC's Conference Room, with a scrumptious morning tea provided by Wild Poppy Café.

The purpose of the event was to bring services together to strengthen referral pathways and networks to ultimately improve holistic care provision in the Merredin community.



In a heartwarming display of gratitude & community spirit, the Thank A Volunteer Gala Dinner Event 80's theme took centre stage on Thursday 29th February 2024. Honouring the unsung heroes, whose selfless contributions enrich the fabric of our community.

Hosted at the elegant Cummins Theatre, the event brought together volunteers, organisers & supporters from our community to celebrate their collective impact. As guests took to their seats for dinner, the program kicked off with a welcome from Jan, the Merredin CRC Coordinator, expressing gratitude for the invaluable contributions of volunteers in various spheres of community life.

Merredin CRC held three markets (April, June, September & December). The April markets were unfortunately cancelled due to inclement weather. The June markets coincided with The Biggest Morning Tea, which made for a great turn out on the day.

The September markets were aligned with the Variety Club Big Bash visit to Merredin & were a huge success

THE PHOENIX

Despite the change to its production and the overall look of The Phoenix, the community has continued to support the community newspaper. The newspaper gives businesses and individuals an opportunity to advertise their businesses and/or employment positions while also giving the community, in general, the opportunity to find out what events are happening and to keep up with important information. The Phoenix is proving to be a well supported community favourite and will continue to be published fortnightly. We have found that the production costs exceed the income from sales and have purchased a new printer to help with this.



MERREDIN SHOW

The Merredin Show Committee and Merredin CRC work closely together to deliver an awesome annual event for the entire community.

The Merredin 2024 Show was a great success with an array of stallholders and a great crowd in attendance. With the reintroduction of the Foat Parade, which saw the main street lined with community member, as they watched the cavalcade of vehicles & floats pass. The winner of the colouring competition received a ride in a Police Car along with his dad too.



INCREASE VOLUNTEERS

Volunteering helps strengthen community and social networks. Volunteers make connections with people they are helping, and they have the opportunity to cultivate friendships with other volunteers.

Merredin CRC benefits from having a large base of dedicated volunteers who assist with a range of duties and events such as Management Committee, Markets, Catering, Community Events, Pet Cemetery, Centrelink and day to day administration operations. Merredin CRC appreciate and value every individual and group volunteer, from those who can only volunteer once a year, to those who volunteer for every event. Every little bit helps!

Many other community and sporting organisations in Merredin rely on volunteer assistance to exist. As such, Merredin CRC is an informal Volunteer Hub for the community, where we encourage, support and recognise volunteers who are working to strengthen our community and sporting organisations. The Volunteer Hub registers, welcomes and matches new volunteers to groups or events that match their interests and skills. The Shire of Merredin acknowledge and support Merredin CRC's role with volunteers through community funding and promotion.

BE SUSTAINABLE

Merredin CRC Management Committee have been very proactive in maintaining a good number of Committee members, with a range of varying knowledge and skills. The Committee meet monthly with the Coordinator in attendance, where we collaboratively reviewed the budget six monthly, and the policies and procedures have been getting reviewed at each meeting & we are on track to having them all completed by December 2024.

The annual Health Check was successfully completed, and the only notable thing was succession planning for the CRC staff wasn't complete, but the Coordinator & the Committee have worked on this throughout the year & have now been successful in having a system & plan in place that now reflects this.

We strive to engage in activities & processes that promote environmental, economic & social sustainability.

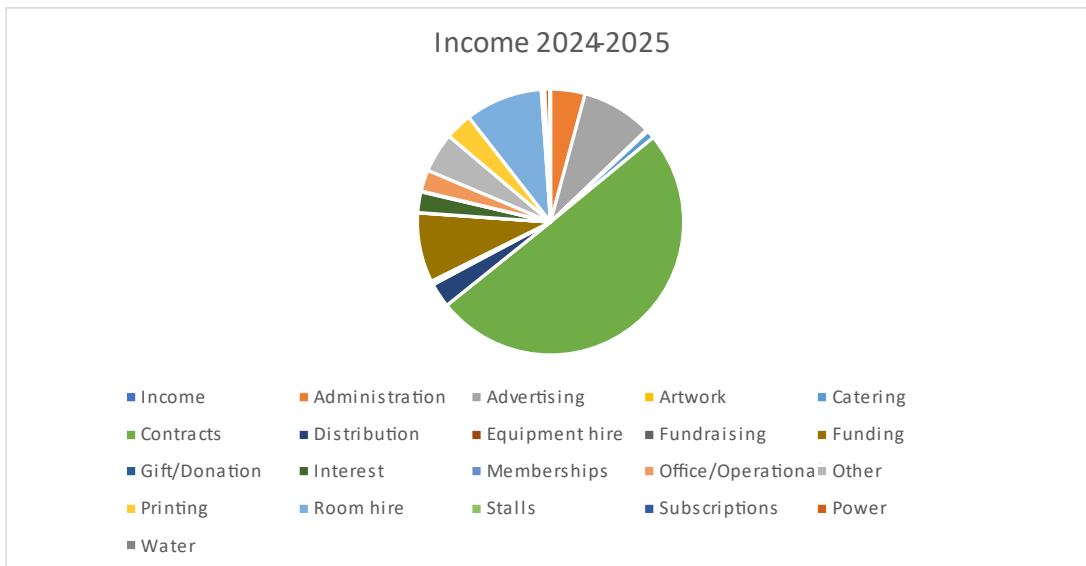

- To ensure that all members of the community have access to information technology facilities.






